

I just came back from one of the "big box stores" in Albany, (you know the type, Restaurant Depot, BJ's, Sam's Club) with all of their loud blaring music (Christmas, I might add), forklifts and their drivers moving pallets of goods all over the place with all of the lights and bells and very loud horns, telling me to move out of the way or get run over. And long lines. (It seems like I am always getting into the line that never seems to move). I am buying supplies for Thanksgiving, yet my senses are being bombarded with Christmas music, Christmas decorations, and Christmas cookies! (UGH!). (yes I said ugh!). I try to remain calm, finding myself greeting the cashier as I leave with a "Happy Christmas,"

I mean Merry Thanksgiving, ugh, I mean Happy Thanksgiving. What season is this?" Inside the car I grab what little hair I have left on my head and want to scream when I hear a small voice say,

"Peace." "Wait! What?" "Peace. Peace I leave with you; My peace I give to you; not as the world gives do I give to you. Do not let your heart be troubled, nor let it be fearful...Peace." (John 14:27)




Our October/November mission was a huge success due to all the wonderful people who donated food for our care boxes. We put together 11 boxes with lots of food and a gift card to Price Chopper.

### **Semi-Annual Congregational Meeting** November 17, 2019

The bi-annual congregational meeting was held on Sunday, November 17th immediately following worship. The meeting was opened with prayer at 10:10 a.m. and a quorum was established.

The nominating committee presented a slate of candidates for consistory: Elders-Edith Bowdish & Olive Taylor Deacons-Ron Burch & Michael Sowle. No nominations from the floor were offered. A vote to accept the slate was carried. The committee was thanked.

Bernie Kirk, Jr. presented the 2020 budget on behalf of the finance committee. A new septic system was installed recently to correct an unexpected issue. The cost was over \$3,000. Bernie pointed out that this is the type of unexpected financial burden that can stress the budget. It was announced that the church had received a bequeath from the estate of Alice Shelp. The need to establish an annual fundraiser that can be as successful as the pancake supper was discussed. The committee was thanked.

A volunteer to post scriptures on the church's website was requested. Karen Kosinski asked for prayer for Schoharie Classis and General Synod as important decisions are coming up. Classis delegates Sue Summerfield and Karen Kosinski were thanked for their work.

Tom Flander commented on the good attendance at the meeting and asked everyone for continued prayer for consistory and for guidance for the church. The meeting closed with prayer at 10:40 a.m.








To my church family,




Through all of the hustle and bustle of the coming weeks and beyond may you find each of these as you look around.


