A Few Moments with Thomas...

Pentecost, Christ the King Sunday, Advent. These are the seasons we are in and the seasons yet to come in our church calendar. In our Earthly calendar we are about to change from the season of summer, enter the season of autumn/fall, and prepare for the season of winter.

The Bible speaks of seasons. There are many scriptures in both the Old and New Testament that speak of seasons. <u>Ecclesiastes</u>

3:1 "For everything there is a season," <u>Daniel 2:21</u> "He changes times and seasons; " <u>Acts 1:7</u> "He said to them, "It is not for you to know times or seasons that the Father has fixed by his own authority." <u>2 Timothy 4:2</u> "Preach the word; be ready in season and out of season; reprove, rebuke, and exhort, with complete patience and teaching." These are just a few but I encourage you to open up the concordance in your bible and study what God's word says about seasons.

I find it interesting how God's word encourages us to <u>be ready in season and out of season</u>. And he gives us jobs to go along with it. To reprove, rebuke, and exhort, with complete patience and teaching. What exactly is he saying to us here?

- Be ready to serve God in any situation whether it's convenient or not.
- Be sensitive to the opportunities God gives you.
- Plus, be ready and sensitive to any correction you may receive also.

Yes, the truth hurts. But we must be willing to change and listen to it so we can more fully obey God.

There are some companies in the world today that are aware of the changing seasons and in a subconscious way are making you prepare for their holidays. Our local Dollar General is a great example of this. While we are ending with the month of September the store has three aisles specifically centered around certain events in our calendar season. One aisle for Halloween, one aisle for Thanksgiving, one aisle for Christmas. They have already planted the seed and each time you go in there you are thinking and preparing for each one of those events without even realizing it. While the worldly goal is for us to be aware of upcoming holidays, the Christian goal for us is to be fully aware of God's seasons and act upon them as called upon.
